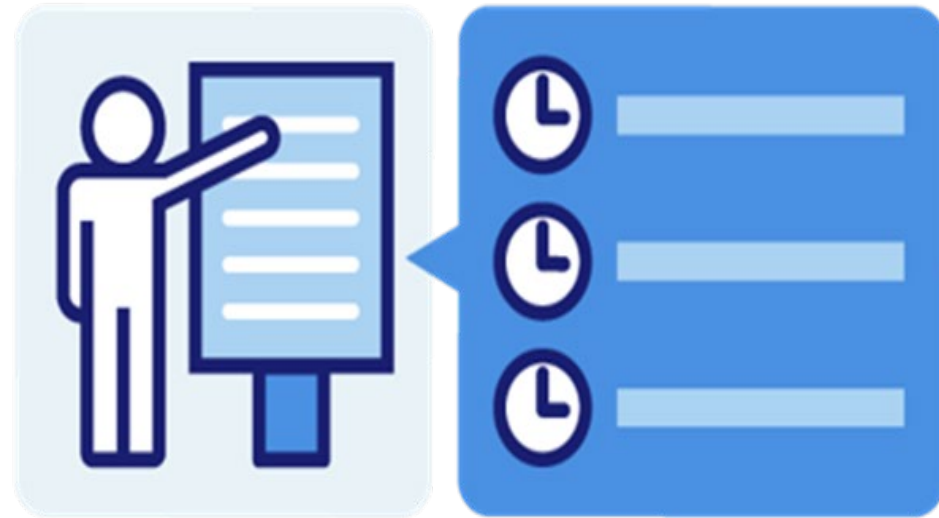

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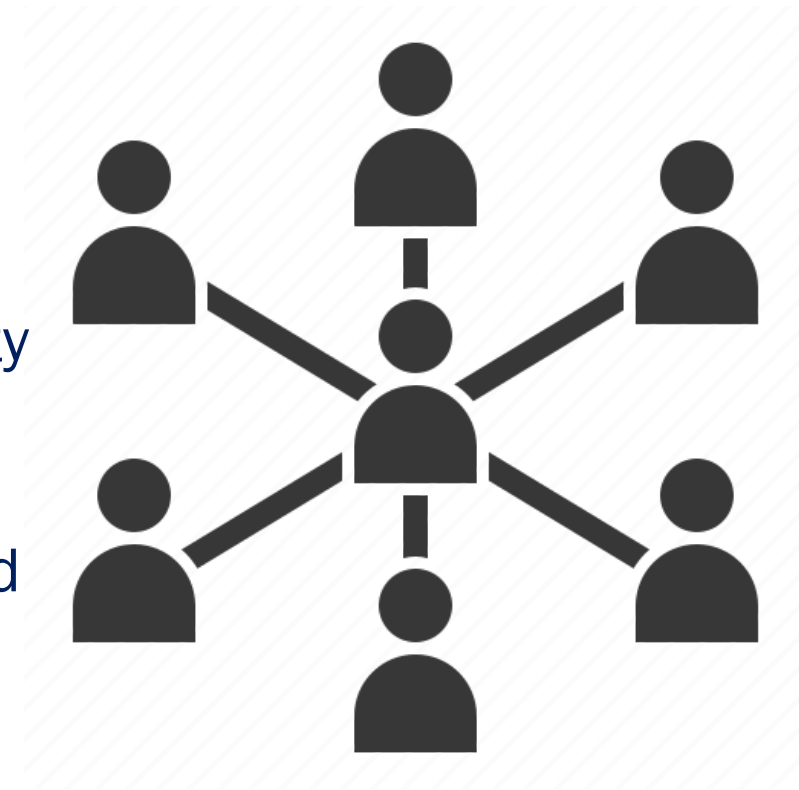
## Clearer Admissions Information

- More information about a student's chance of getting an offer to various programs will be displayed. For example, we will share the number of waitlist offers a program has made in the past so families can better assess their chances of receiving an offer through the waitlist process.



## Screening

- Superintendents have been tasked with partnering with the school communities' leadership, staff, and parents to thoughtfully determine if and where middle school screened programs should exist based on instructional and community needs.
- The number of academically screened schools will be limited and based on the needs of the community.



## Screening

- Where screening is allowed, students would be ranked based on a composite of their course grades from fourth grade.
- In various citywide programs, middle school programs admitting students through the audition, language: criteria, or screened admissions methods will not have a sibling priority, as those programs have distinct criteria for admission.

# Updates to Middle School Admissions

## Screening

- Prior to COVID, two schools in District 24 had G&T screeners
  - IS 73 & PS/IS 119
- As a result of COVID, screeners were no longer used, and a lottery system was put in place

- If a screener is selected by our community, only the fourth-grade final grades on the report card will be used to determine eligibility
